CHARTER

1. The participants acknowledge that they share the one faith in God and in Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour, in the Holy Spirit, according to the Scriptures.
2. Despite the sometimes pronounced diversity of their theological or ecclesiastical ideas and manifestations, the participants wish to live in brotherly communion with one another since they have been called to witness in one and the same city.
3. In the special environment of the Brussels conurbation, the participants are aware of the need for joint service in our increasingly secularized society.

They therefore believe that establishing links in the form of an organization in which representatives of the Christian communities in Brussels could meet regularly would make it possible :

to work out more accurately their approach to the problems of the city

- a. because they would be better informed of men's real needs;
- b. by making more effective the service the churches are called upon to provide for the inhabitants of the city – particularly those left to their own devices in this affluent society;

to learn how to work together, through getting to know each other better, in order

- a. to get into the habit gradually of consulting each other on problems of common concern, both internal and external;
- b. to coordinate their efforts in specific schemes and projects.
